

THE NATIONAL DIET LIBRARY'S COLLECTION OF BOOKS PRINTED IN THE MEIJI ERA Microfilm Collection

The Meiji Era (1868-1911) which begun with the Meiji Restoration, was a period marked by several significant projects carried out on a national scale to bring about the modernisation and westernisation of Japan. It is imperative that publications documenting the developments during this important period in Japanese history be preserved and passed on to future generations as a cultural legacy.

The amount of books transferred to microfilm numbers approximately 110,000 (160,000 volumes) 70% of all books printed in the Meiji era. Many subjects (Social Sciences, Humanities, Natural Sciences, Engineering, and Medical Sciences) are included as attached, and are divided into 28 subject categories. Each subject is divided into subsets. The subset is the minimum unit of sale.
