Haroucrt suggested rather that a new book should be made out of the new material, on the grounds that the public would not read a revision but merely note the changes from reviews. Keynes agreed and proposed the title *German Reparation: Essays supplementary to the 'The Economic Consequences of The Peace'*; this was changed to the present title on the advice of Donald Brace, Harcourts partner. €220.00
